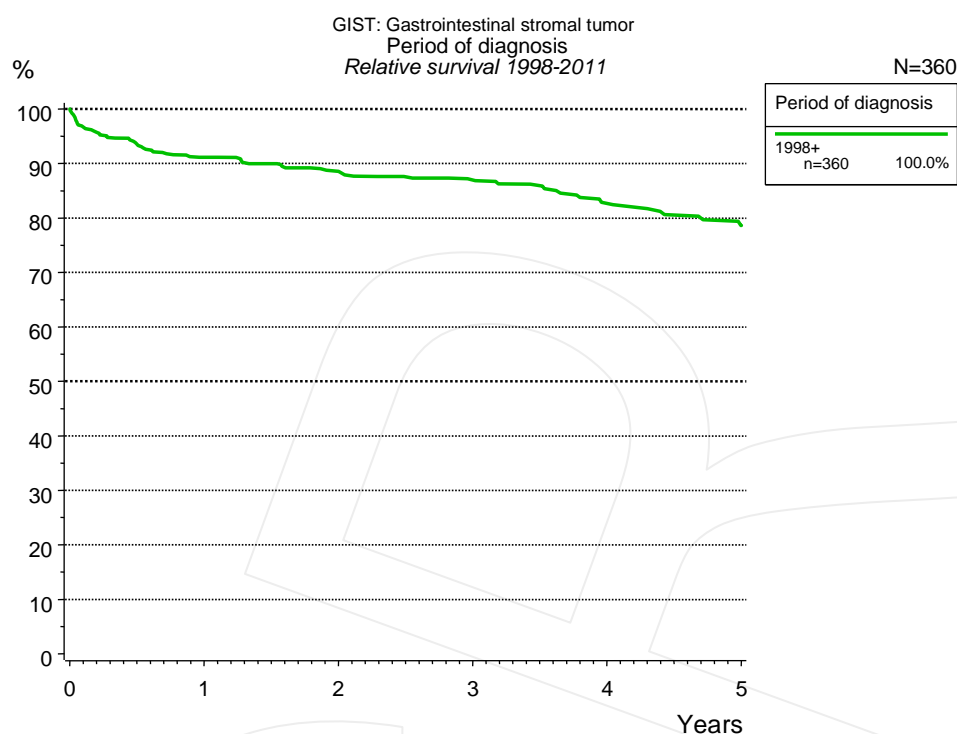


Figure 1a. Relative survival of patients with gastroint. stromal tumor by period of diagnosis. Included in the evaluation are 360 cases diagnosed between 1998 and 2011.

The presented survival curves are derived from clinical records with valid follow-up informations, which means that death certificate cases (DCO) cases are omitted from the analysis. With this one restriction, the MCR has provided population-based statistics since 1998, collecting data on all cancer cases in the region of southern Bavaria. Historical data of previous time periods can be heavily selected, therefore, univariate survival comparisons of the presented time periods must be carefully considered. Nonetheless, all calculable survival curves are depicted to facilitate the comparison of long time follow-up analyses of relative survival between particular cancers.

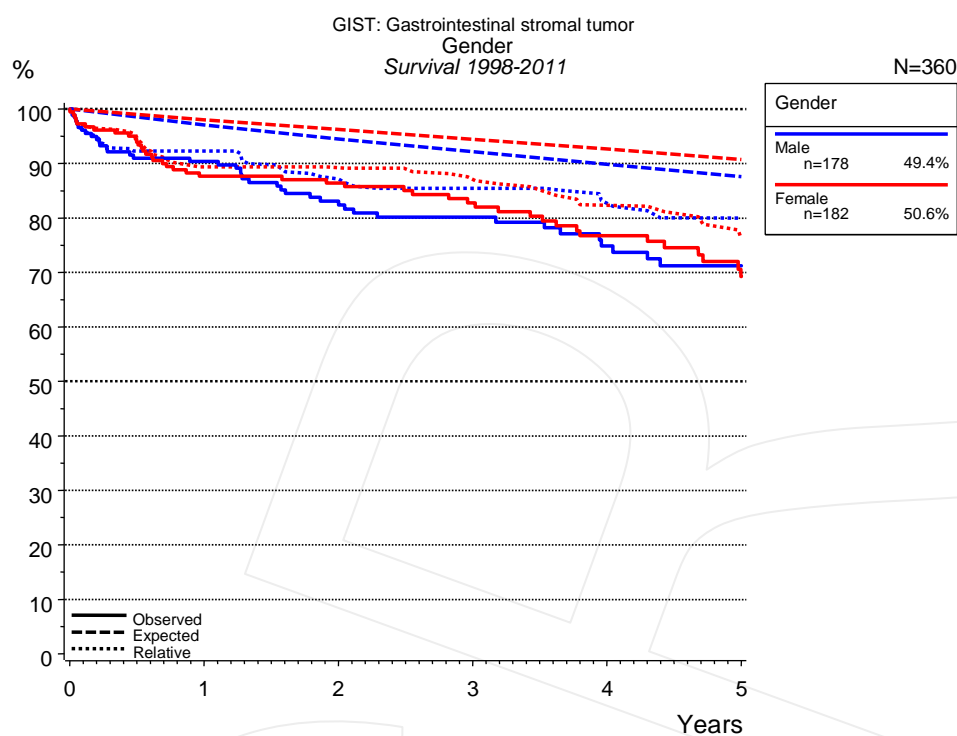


Figure 2a. Survival of patients with gastroint. stromal tumor by gender. Included in the evaluation are 360 cases diagnosed between 1998 and 2011.

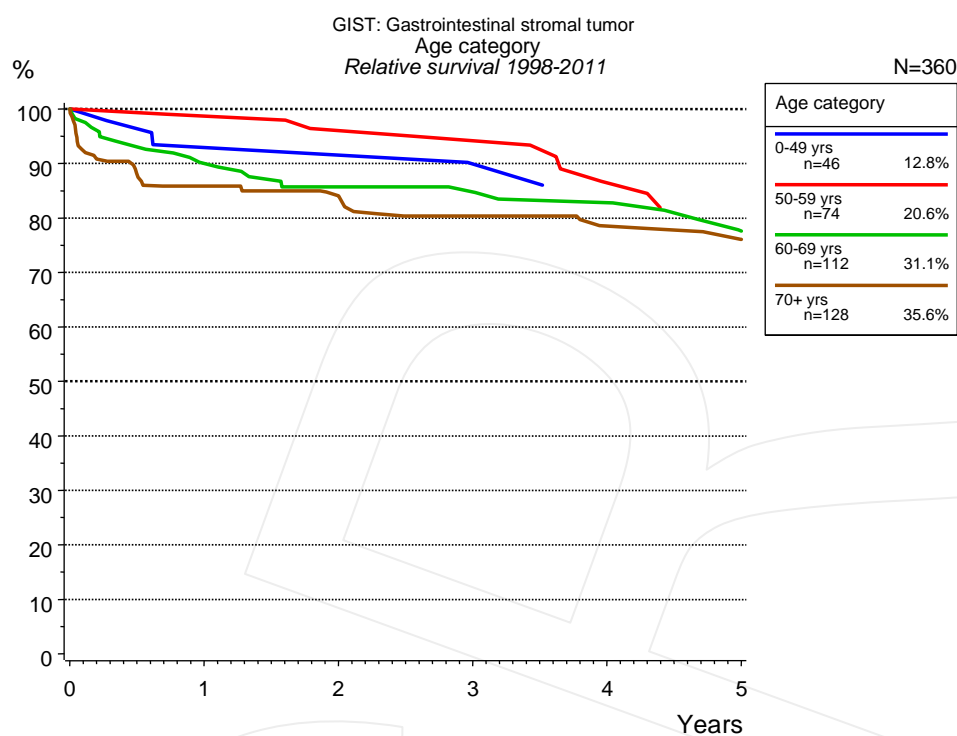


Figure 3a. Relative survival of patients with gastroint. stromal tumor by age category. Included in the evaluation are 360 cases diagnosed between 1998 and 2011.

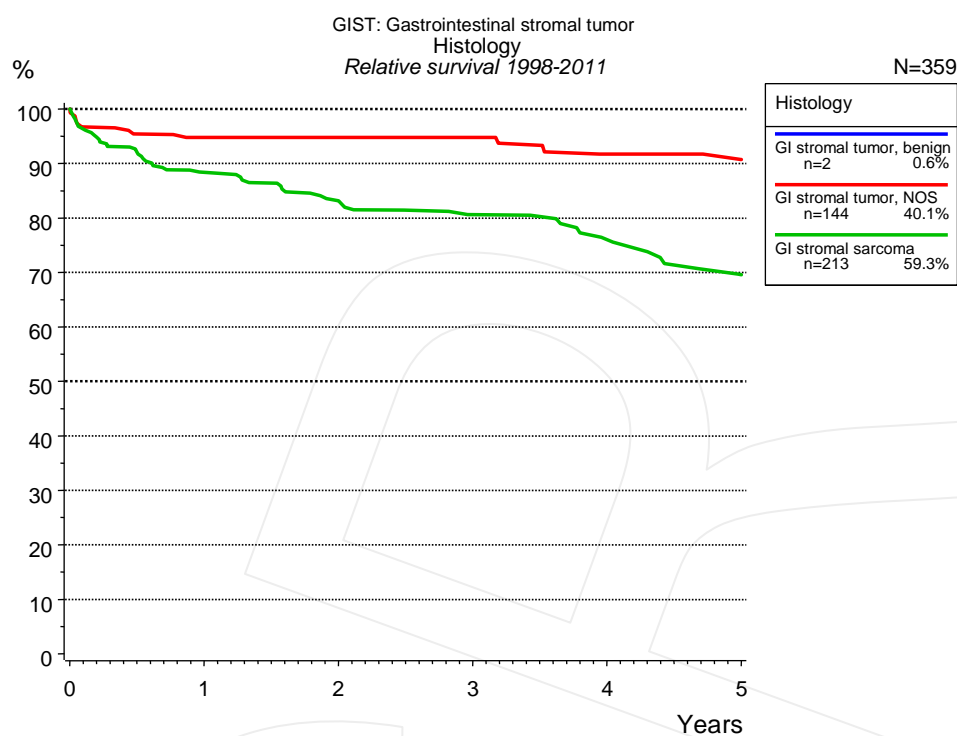


Figure 4a. Relative survival of patients with gastroint. stromal tumor by histology. For 359 of 360 cases diagnosed between 1998 and 2011 valid data could be obtained for this item. Subgroups with sample size <15 are dropped from the chart.

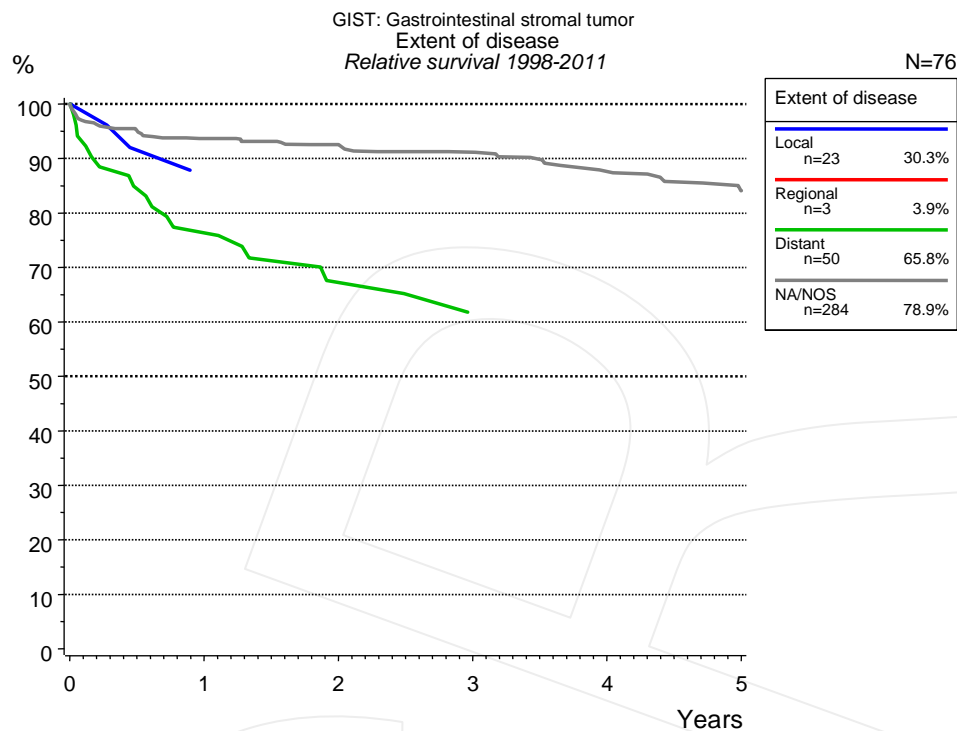


Figure 4c. Relative survival of patients with gastroint. stromal tumor by extent of disease. For 112 of 360 cases diagnosed between 1998 and 2011 valid data could be obtained for this item. For a total of 76 cases an evaluable classification was established. The grey line represents the subgroup of 284 patients with missing values regarding extent of disease (78.9% of 360 patients, the percent values of all other categories are related to n=76). Subgroups with sample size <15 are dropped from the chart.

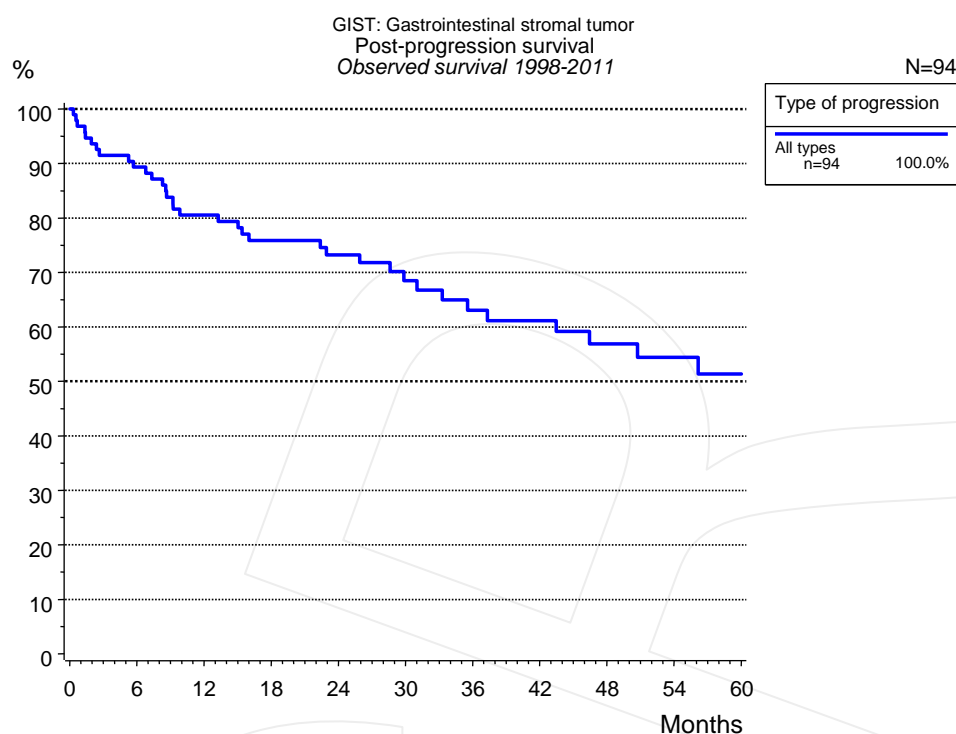


Figure 5a. Observed post-progression survival of 94 patients with gastroint. stromal tumor diagnosed between 1998 and 2011 (incl. M1). These 94 patients with documented progression events during their course of disease represent 26.1% of the totally 360 evaluated cases. Patients with cancer relapse documented via death certificates only were excluded (n=18, 5.0%).

Medical record documentation often lacks the linguistic severity to distinguish between local relapse, regional lymph node metastasis and distant spread in solid cancers. Frequently, the statement "not specified" is the only information in registries regarding relapse of the disease. The category "All types" denotes all cases who suffered from at least one relapse during the course of disease (incl. primary M1-status). Although, the real number of relapsed patients is likely to be much higher. The accumulated percentage of patients with local relapse or distant metastasis exceeds the 100% value because patients are potentially considered in more than one subgroup.
