


**Figure 1a.** Relative survival of patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer by period of diagnosis. Included in the evaluation are 558 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.

The survival results of the SEER program (Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results) of the American National Cancer Institute (NCI) are summarized as the period of diagnosis from 1998 to 2011, and are represented by gray diamonds in order to facilitate comparisons between MCR and SEER.

The presented survival curves are derived from clinical records with valid follow-up informations, which means that death certificate cases (DCO) cases are omitted from the analysis. With this one restriction, the MCR has provided populationbased statistics since 1998, collecting data on all cancer cases in the region of southern Bavaria. Historical data of previous time periods can be heavily selected, therefore, univariate survival comparisons of the presented time periods must be carefully considered. Nonetheless, all calculable survival curves are depicted to facilitate the comparison of long time follow-up analyses of relative survival between particular cancers.




**Figure 2a.** Survival of patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer by gender. Included in the evaluation are 558 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.




**Figure 3a.** Relative survival of patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer by age category. Included in the evaluation are 558 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.


**Figure 4a.** Relative survival of patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer by TNM staging. For 443 of 558 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014 valid data could be obtained for this item. For a total of 441 cases an evaluable classification was established. The accumulated percentage exceeds the 100% value because patients are potientially considered in more than one subgroup. The grey line represents the subgroup of 117 patients with missing values regarding TNM staging (21.0% of 558 patients, the percent values of all other categories are related to n=441).


**Figure 5a.** Time to first progression of 422 patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer diagnosed between 1998 and 2014 (M0 only in solid cancers) estimated by cumulative incidence function (CI, solid line) accounting for death as competing risk and by inverse Kaplan-Meier estimate (1-KM, dashed line). The frequency of events may be underestimated due to underreporting.




**Figure 5c.** Observed post-progression survival of 161 patients with nasal cavity, middle ear, sinuses cancer diagnosed between 1998 and 2014. These 161 patients with documented progression events during their course of disease represent 36.9% of the totally 436 evaluated cases (incl. M1, n=14, 3.2%). Patients with cancer relapse documented via death certificates only were excluded (n=38, 8.7%). Multiple progression types on different sites are included in the evaluation even when not occuring synchronously. The NOS (not otherwise specified) class is included under the condition, that it is the one and only progression type during the course of disease.

Medical record documentation often lacks the linguistic severity to distinguish between local relapse, regional lymph node metastasis and distant spread in solid cancers. Frequently, the statement "not specified" is the only information in registries regarding relapse of the disease. The category "Any type" denotes all cases who suffered from at least one relapse during the course of disease (incl. primary M1-status). Although, the real number of relapsed patients is likely to be much higher. The accumulated percentage of patients with local relapse or distant metastasis exceeds the 100% value because patients are potientially considered in more than one subgroup.
