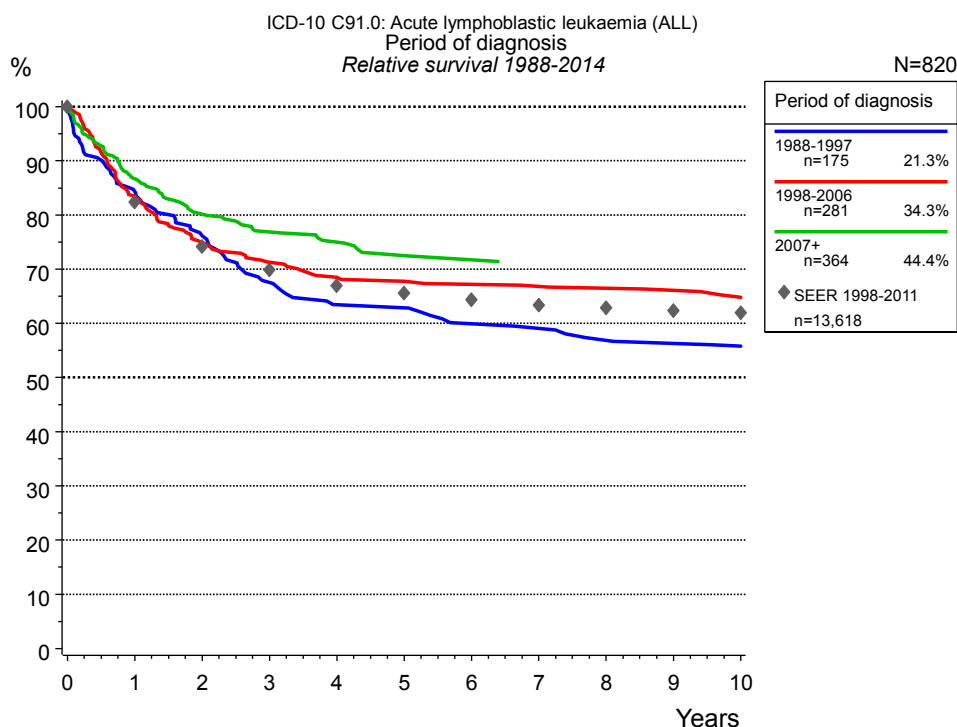


Figure 1a. Relative survival of patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia by period of diagnosis. Included in the evaluation are 820 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.

The presented survival curves are derived from clinical records with valid follow-up informations, which means that death certificate cases (DCO) cases are omitted from the analysis. With this one restriction, the MCR has provided population-based statistics since 1998, collecting data on all cancer cases in the region of southern Bavaria. Historical data of previous time periods can be heavily selected, therefore, univariate survival comparisons of the presented time periods must be carefully considered. Nonetheless, all calculable survival curves are depicted to facilitate the comparison of long time follow-up analyses of relative survival between particular cancers.

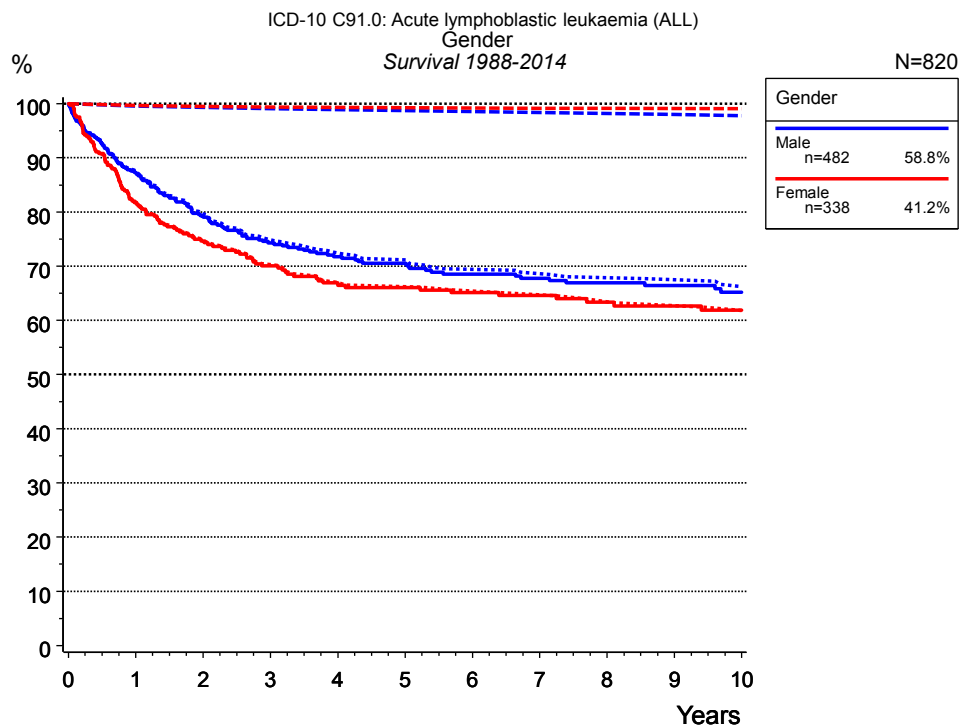


Figure 2a. Survival of patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia by gender. Included in the evaluation are 820 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.

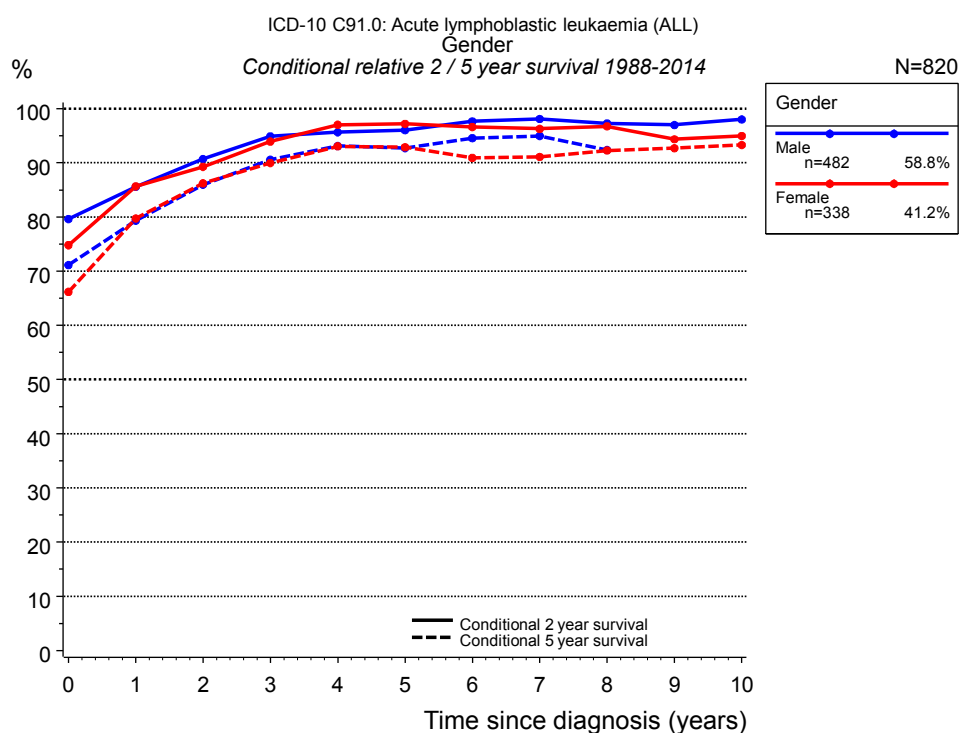


Figure 2c. Conditional relative 2 / 5-year survival of patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia by gender. For 820 of 820 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014 valid data could be obtained for this item.

Conditional relative survival rates refer to the relative survival probability, in this case for 2 and 5 years after cancer diagnosis, compared to the age- and sex-matched population (=100%) under the condition of being alive for a certain time period (x-axis in Figure 2a). The results illustrate to what extent the cancer induced mortality of particular subgroups declines in the subsequent years after detection of the malignancy. For instance, according to the presented survival statistics, patients in the subgroup gender="Male", who are alive at least 3 years after cancer diagnosis, the conditional relative 2-year survival rate is 94.9% (n=276).

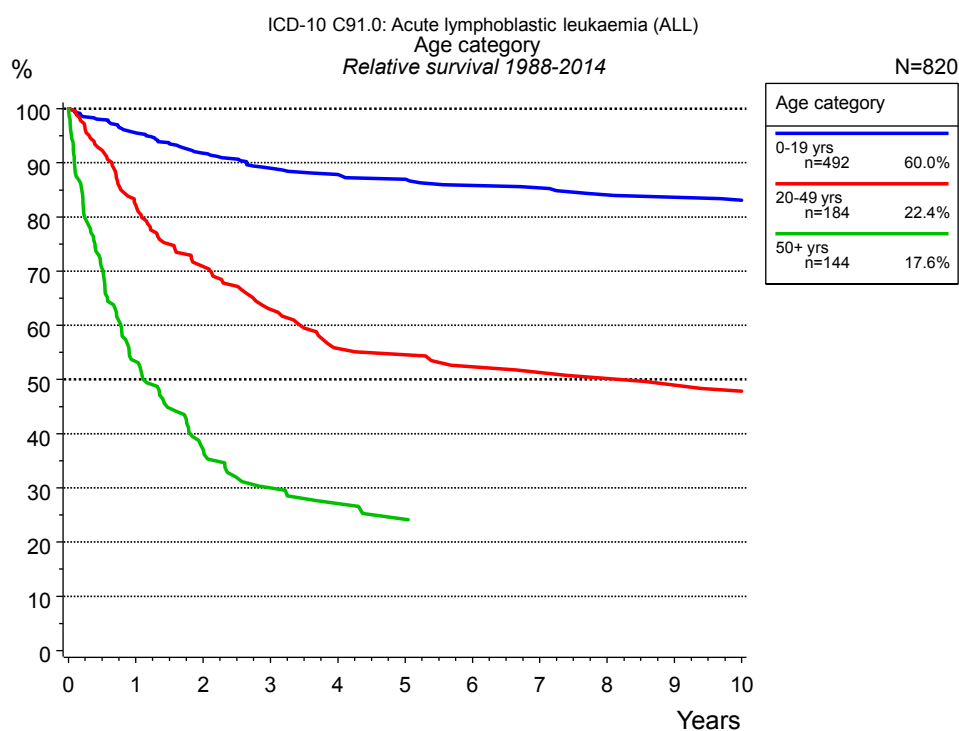


Figure 3a. Relative survival of patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia by age category. Included in the evaluation are 820 cases diagnosed between 1988 and 2014.

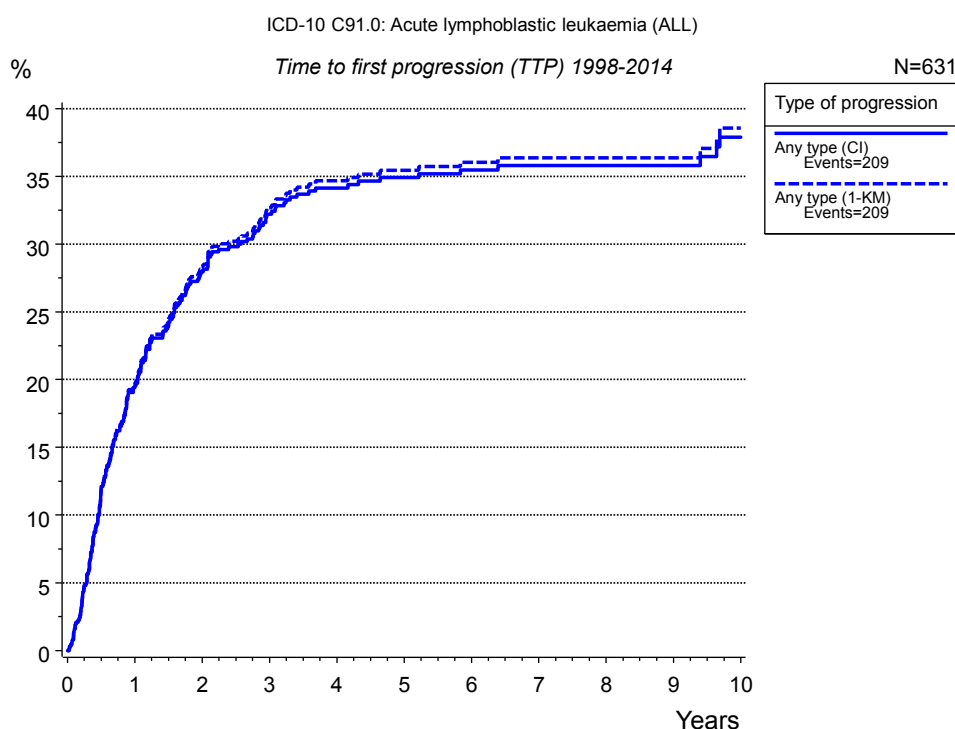


Figure 5a. Time to first progression of 631 patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia diagnosed between 1998 and 2014 (M0 only in solid cancers) estimated by cumulative incidence function (CI, solid line) accounting for death as competing risk and by inverse Kaplan-Meier estimate (1-KM, dashed line). The frequency of events may be underestimated due to underreporting.

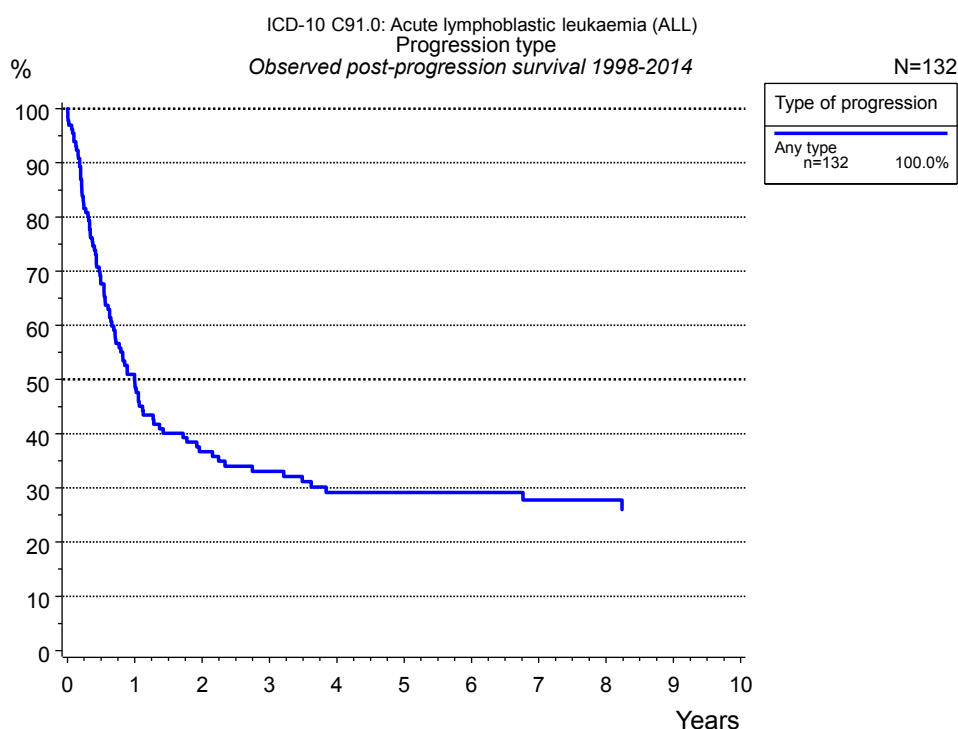


Figure 5c. Observed post-progression survival of 132 patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia diagnosed between 1998 and 2014. These 132 patients with documented progression events during their course of disease represent 20.9 % of the totally 631 evaluated cases. Patients with cancer relapse documented via death certificates only were excluded (n=77, 12.2 %).

Medical record documentation often lacks the linguistic severity to distinguish between local relapse, regional lymph node metastasis and distant spread in solid cancers. Frequently, the statement “not specified” is the only information in registries regarding relapse of the disease. The category “Any type” denotes all cases who suffered from at least one relapse during the course of disease (incl. primary M1-status). Although, the real number of relapsed patients is likely to be much higher. The accumulated percentage of patients with local relapse or distant metastasis exceeds the 100% value because patients are potentially considered in more than one subgroup.

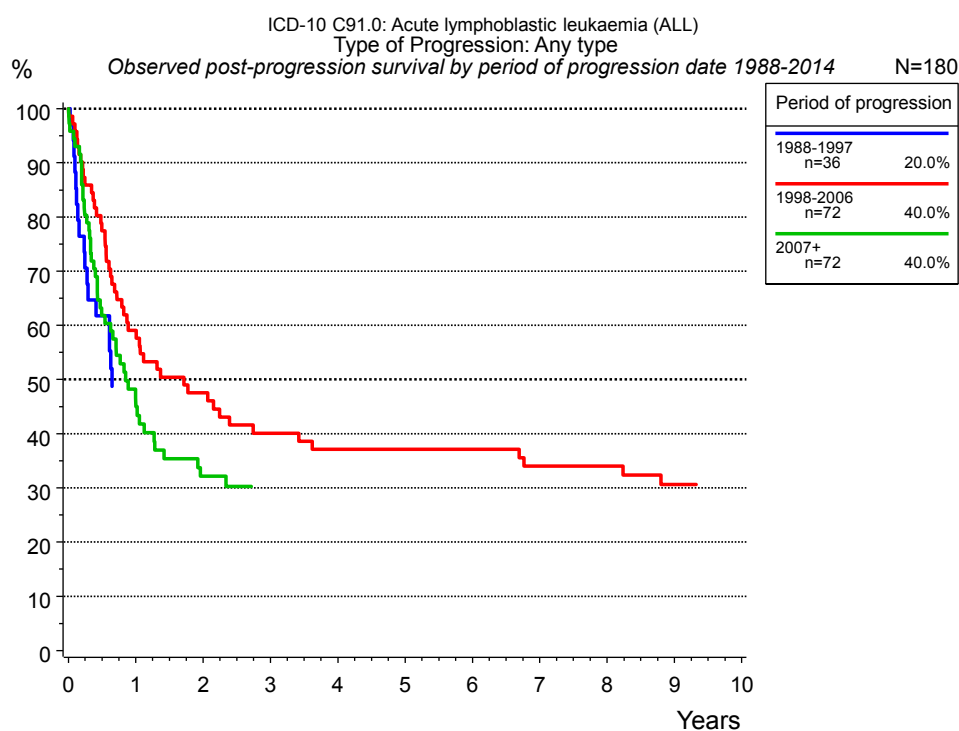


Figure 5e. Observed post-progression (any type) survival of 180 patients with acute lymphobl. leukaemia diagnosed between 1988 and 2014 by period of progression.
